SUMMER MODESTY & DECORUM

he summer season is here and with it comes the temptation to wear clothing that is at times inappropriate and immodest. This is influenced by the current fashion trends in clothing.

Although it is true that current fashions do not favour the practice of the virtue of modesty, this should not be an excuse or justification for forgetting these virtues and thinking that we can now dress as we please, that is, without respecting the parameters these virtues call us to.

When you have a job interview, a wedding or an event with the King, it doesn't cross your mind to arrive in runners, disheveled in your pyjamas or in a swimsuit with flip-flops. In our case, when we enter the church, we are going to visit the King of kings, God, and he we owe it to Him to dress with modesty and decorum.

At the heart of modesty and decorum is that Christ knows your inner self, he knows us better than we know it ourselves. Taking care of the inner beauty, our predisposition to go to mass, this must also be reflected on the outside which translates into respect and decorum.

We know that the lack of modesty can be scandalous and that it can lead to sin, and this is a another reason for us to consider dressing modestly and with decorum.

The Church's teaching is helpful to understand this further and in a deeper way:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that: "Purity requires modesty, an integral part of temperance. Modesty protects the intimate center of the person. It means refusing to unveil what should remain hidden. It is ordered to

chastity to whose sensitivity it bears witness. It guides how one looks at others and behaves toward them in conformity with the dignity of persons and their solidarity. (N. 2521)

"Modesty protects the mystery of persons and their love. It encourages patience and moderation in loving relationships; it requires that the conditions for the definitive giving and commitment of man and woman to one another be fulfilled. Modesty is decency. It inspires one's choice of clothing. It keeps silence or reserve where there is evident risk of unhealthy curiosity. It is discreet." (N. 2522)

"There is a modesty of the feelings as well as of the body. It protests, for example, against the voveuristic explorations of the human body in certain advertisements, or against the solicitations of certain media that go too far in the exhibition of intimate things. Modesty inspires a way of life which makes it possible to resist the allurements of fashion and the pressures of prevailing ideologies. "(N. 2523)

So let us not be afraid to state forcefully that modesty is still a virtue, and a very important one, given the consequences suffered when we neglect it.

One of the world's greatest fashion influencers, Coco Channel, once stated: "It's not the looks, it's the essence. It's not the money, it's the education. It's not the clothes, it's the class." At the end of the day "Beauty Should Begin in the Heart and Soul, otherwise cosmetics are useless. " If we apply this in our lives, everything that is in our soul will be reflected on the outside.
