TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

In October 1994 Pope John Paul II called together a synod on consecrated life in the Catholic Church. Questions were being asked about the relevance of religious orders, institutes devoted to contemplation, societies of apostolic life, secular institutes and other groups of consecrated persons. Some said that consecrated life is a kind of "waste" of human energies which might be used more efficiently elsewhere for a greater good, for the benefit of humanity and the Church.

The synod consulted widely and discussed deeply and made recommendations to Pope John Paul II. He prayed and worked at writing an Apostolic Exhortation to the Church on the goodness of the consecrated life. He used the Transfiguration of Jesus to explain the wonder of the three states of life in the Church: lay women and men, ordained ministers and consecrated persons.

Please look up the entire document Vita Consecrata 1996 on the internet (vatican.va) a most enlightening and pleasing read!! Below are a few excerpts from Pope John Paul's encouraging writing on the ways lay people, ordained ministers and consecrated persons build each other up in God's plan:

N. 15 The event of the Transfiguration marks a decisive moment in the ministry of Jesus. It is a revelatory event which strengthens the faith in the disciples' hearts, prepares them for the tragedy of the Cross and prefigures the glory of the Resurrection. This mystery is constantly relived by the Church, the people on its way to the (heavenly) encounter with its Lord.

N. 31 By virtue of their rebirth in Christ, all the faithful share a common dignity; all are called to holiness; all cooperate in the building up of the

one Body of Christ, each in accordance with the proper vocation and gift which he or she has received from the Spirit (Rom. 12, 3 - 8). The equal dignity of all members of the Church is the work of the Spirit, is rooted in Baptism and Confirmation and is strengthened by the Eucharist. But diversity is also a work of the Spirit.

N. 31 For the mission of the lay faithful, whose proper task is to "seek the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God", the consecration of Baptism and Confirmation common to all members of the People of God is a sufficient foundation. In addition to this basic consecration, ordained ministers receive the consecration of ordination in order to carry on the apostolic ministry in time. Consecrated persons, who embrace the evangelical counsels, receive a new and special consecration which, without being sacramental, commits them to making their own — in chastity, poverty and obedience — the way of life practiced personally by Jesus and proposed by him to his disciples.

Let us continue to pray for each other . . . that whatever way the Lord calls us beyond our baptism to serve Him . . . whether in the single life, married life, ordained or consecrated life . . . that we do it with courage, generosity and happiness for God's glory and the salvation of others.
