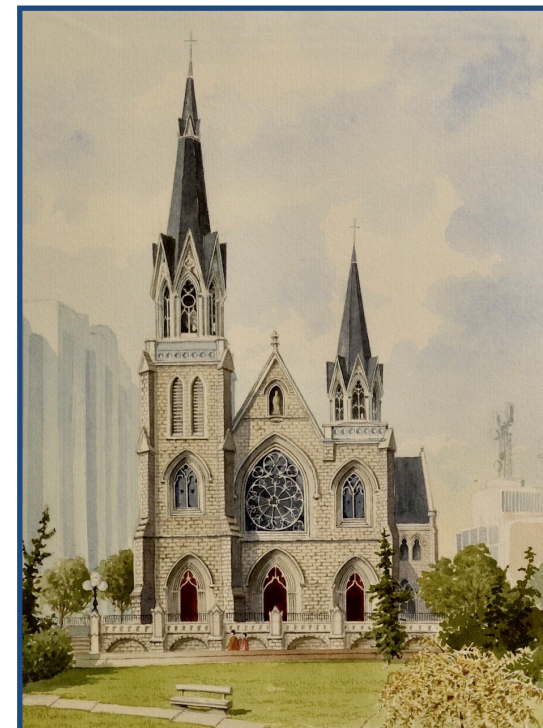

**NOVEMBER INDULGENCES**

Now that we are well into autumn, with the shorter days and longer nights and the first cold weather beginning to set in, the month of November is upon us and with it the day dedicated to all the saints and the souls in purgatory. We in the Church Militant remember the Church Triumphant on November 1 and the Church Penitent on November 2.

November 1 commemorates the unknown saints, whom we have come across history; many have not been raised to the altars or canonised because they passed through life in silence. Only God knew them and only He, when receiving them into His Kingdom, will have sanctified their souls. On this special day for Christians, we celebrate the feast of all those who have passed through the world enriching us with their lives full of love and holiness.

November 2 invites us to remember our deceased relatives and friends. In many countries it is very common to make visits to cemeteries for those who want to visit the mortal remains of loved ones. It is a day of remembrance. We remember all the people we have loved and whom death has taken away from us. It is a day for remembrance, but also for prayer. To pray to the Lord for our dead and for those we do not know who are also sleeping the eternal sleep. However, it is also a day of hope. The hope that springs from God's love and the salvation he offers us.

Did you know that it is possible to obtain a Plenary Indulgence in the month of November for a deceased loved one?

According to the Code of Canon Law, 'an indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment for sins, already forgiven as to guilt, which a faithful, willing and fulfilling certain conditions, obtains through the mediation of the Church'. The Plenary Indulgence frees us from the temporal punishment of sins confessed and

forgiven, from the moment of Baptism until the date on which the plenary indulgence is obtained. Getting an indulgence for the soul of a deceased relative or friend represents a work of great mercy, since it frees him or her from the pain of their forgiven sins and may hasten their departure from Purgatory.

Concerning the Plenary Indulgence in favour of the dead, the *Indulgentiarum Doctrina* (1967) establishes in its norm number 15 the following: 'In all churches, public or - by those who legitimately employ them - semi-public oratories, a plenary indulgence applicable only in favour of the dead can be gained on November 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Visits to Churches:

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to souls in purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who, on the day on which the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed is celebrated, piously visit a church or oratory. This indulgence may be gained either on the above-mentioned day or, with the consent of the Ordinary, on the Sunday before or after, or on the Solemnity of All Saints.

Visits to the cemetery when visiting from November 1<sup>st</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup>:

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who piously visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased.

To gain a plenary indulgence, in addition to the desire to avoid any mortal or venial sin, three conditions must be met: 1) Sacramental Confession, 2) Eucharistic Communion and 3) Prayer for the Pope's intentions.

The three conditions can be fulfilled a few days before or after praying or doing the work that incorporates the indulgence, but it is convenient that Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions be done on the same day by praying in his intention a single Our Father and a Hail Mary; but it is granted to each faithful the faculty of praying with any formula, according to his piety and devotion.
